As you know we have begun our scheduled deliveries of the BCM for the state police swat team, in furtherance of our cooperative endeavor to create the Louisiana Maritime Special Response Team. From the very beginning of this partnership, I have always believed that in order for this initiative to be achieved in the safest and most effective way, we each must be trained in each other's area of expertise. Wildlife agents must be trained in SWAT tactics and troopers must be trained boat operations and seamanship.

I also believe that this is important throughout our maritime domain with all our marine law enforcement and 1st responders. The foundation that the BOAT program provides is the minimum standard needed for marine law enforcement and 1st responders to provide safety and security, to be true force multipliers. This foundation can be built on with additional training and experience throughout their careers.
