

Carbon Monoxide Warning Stickers

New Minnesota requirement may apply to your boat

Effective May 1, 2017: A total of three carbon monoxide (CO) warning stickers are **required** for all gasoline-powered motorboats with an enclosed occupancy compartment* while operating on Minnesota waters. The appropriate sticker must be placed at the:


- **helm** (steering station)
- **stern**
- **cabin** (in or at the entrance to the enclosed occupancy compartment)

Stickers are not required, but are strongly recommended on the following watercraft:

- Diesel-powered motorboats: Display the stickers at the helm, stern, and if applicable, in the cabin.
- Open motorboats: Display the “helm” and “stern” warning stickers.
- Boats with canvas or three sided enclosures: Display all three stickers.

* Enclosed occupancy compartment: One contiguous enclosed space surrounded by boat structure that may be occupied by a person.



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Attach at helm

Engine and generator exhaust contains odorless and colorless carbon monoxide gas.


Carbon monoxide will be around the back of the boat when engines or generators are running. Keep back at least 20 feet.

Move to fresh air and get medical help if you feel **nausea, headache, dizziness or drowsiness.**

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Attach at stern

Carbon Monoxide (CO) can cause brain damage or death.

Carbon monoxide can be present in the cabin.

Signs of carbon monoxide poisoning include **nausea, headache, dizziness, drowsiness and lack of consciousness,** even at low levels.

Get fresh air and medical help if anyone shows signs of carbon monoxide poisoning or carbon monoxide alarm sounds.

Carbon monoxide detector must be functioning at all times.
